As referees or Assistant Referees we receive feedback on our performance in a number of ways:

Instant – We make decisions all the time so we receive feedback from players, coaches and spectators		Biased, prejudiced, issue of credibility
Assessors or Inspection Reports		Integrity – Trustworthy, honest, reliability, knowledge, ability to communicate, etc
Critical Friends / Colleagues / Mentor (Referees)		Integrity – Trust, honesty, reliability, knowledge, position, etc
Critical Friends (Not Referees)		Integrity, knowledge, ability to communicate
Personal Assessment – Self Assessment / Evaluation – You generally know when you have had a good or bad game?		Internal feedback – Intrinsic motivation
Family		Issue of knowledge of the laws of the game
Media Reports – Local or daily papers		Accuracy, Reliability, Integrity, Trustworthiness,
Video Performance		Highly accurate, very reliable, etc

NOTE - We receive information and data from a number of sources

- What we do with this information is the crucial question?

- Its how we **unpack** this **data** and or **information** that is crucial – Each of us are unique and as a result our motivations are different

Factors crucial to feedback

Do I have the desire to Improve? Do I have the intrinsic motivation to succeed? ATTITUDE / GOAL
Do I have a coach or mentor to seek honest feedback?
Do I create the opportunity to practice what I need to improve?
